#### Murozumi Beach

Murozumi Beach is a beautiful, 4.7 kilometer long beach. Japanese Black Pines grow along the coastline.

#### **Puffer Fish Spawning**

Large swarms of pufferfish come to the coast of the Murozumi Peninsula for spawning from the middle of May to early July every year.

# Cape Zobigasaki

It is called "Zobigasaki" because it looks like an elephant's nose. It's also called Suohashidate because it's very beautiful just like Amanohashidate (Heavenly Bridge) which is one of the three most scenic spots in Japan.

#### **Gabisan Forest**

It remains a virgin forest to this day. It is designated as a national natural monument.

#### **Ushima Island**

It is an inhabited remote island that can be reached in about 20 minutes from Murozumi Port by taking the regular ship "Ushimaru". On the island, there is a colony of Japanese magnolia, which has been designated as a natural monument by the prefecture, and its yellow flowers bloom during the Tanabata season.

Ushijima, which is rich in nature, is also home to the Japanese crow pigeon, which is listed in Yamaguchi Prefecture's Red Data Book Yamaguchi. Certainly! The Seto Inland Sea is home to dugongs, and during the spring and summer months, if you're lucky,you might spot them when crossing to Ushi Island by boat. These gentle marine mammals are fascinating creatures. Let me share more about them.

#### Mt. Iwaki Prefectural Natural Park

It is a mysterious area consisting of a mountain castle centered around a mountain castle surrounded by a series of stones called Kamagoishi, located around the 8th station of the mountain. There are historical sites such as the remains of the training ground and headquarters of the Second Kiheitai, Ishiki Shrine, Zuishinmon, and Jingoji Temple.

#### Cobalt Line

#### Yuhinotaki Falls

The headwater is Fujigatou(382 meters). Yuhinotaki Falls has a difference of 10 meters in elevation.



A hiking course with a total length of approximately 14 km that connects Mt. Senbo and Mt. Omine. While looking at the islands and coastline floating in the Seto Inland Sea, you can also enjoy nature watching such as flowers, wild birds, and insects blooming in the surrounding area. Along the route, there



are two observation decks and seven forests and open spaces, perfect for playing with children.

#### Haginodaira Observatory

It's one of the wonderful observatories on the Cobalt Line.You can see the Seto Inland Sea and Murozumi Island. On a sunny day, you can see Kunisaki Island in Kyushu.





#### Shimata River

The Shimada River, which flows through the center of Hikari City, is a second-class river with a total length of 34.5 km that originates in Shuto-cho, lwakuni City and flows into the Seto Inland Sea at Hikari City. Seasonal flowers bloom along the river, and you can enjoy playing in the water.

#### Nijigahama Beach

It is a beautiful natural coastline with white sand and green pine trees that stretches for about 2.4km. The beach is wide and shallow, with fine sand, and has been selected as one of Japan's top 100 beaches, one of Japan's top 100 forests for forest bathing, and one of Japan's top 100 white sand and green pine beaches. The origin of the name Nijigahama is said to come from the fact that when you look at the beach from the sea, it looks like a rainbow bridge.







#### Hirobumi Ito Memorial Park

Inside the park are the Ito Public Museum, the former Ito Hirobumi We have many historical places and places with cultural heritage.

residence, and Ito Hirobumi's birthplace. The museum has an exhibition room, a theater hall, etc., and introduces Hirobumi Ito's achievements through his belongings, photographs, and literature. The birthplace of Hirobumi Ito (childhood name: Risuke Hayashi) is a restored version of the house where he lived until he was 9 years old. Behind the birthplace, there is a well that is said to have been used for his birth bath, and a persimmon tree where he played in his childhood. It still remains today.




# The First Prime Minister of Japan

Hirobumi Ito

Hirobumi Ito was born in Hikari and lived here until he was 9 years old. He attended the Shoka Sonjuku School where he was instructed by Shoin Yoshida. Following the Meiji Restoration,

he assumed his post as the first Prime Minister of Japan. Afterwards, he was involved in the enactment of the Constitution of the Empire of Japan as the President of the Privy Council.





#### Mt. Iwaki

There is a road leading to the summit of Mt. Ishijo, and you can climb it on foot or by car. Near the summit, there are the main shrine of Ishiki Shrine, which is a nationally designated important cultural property, as well as the ruins of the Second Kiheitai Drill Ground and Honjin. Near the 8th station of the mountain, there is a sacred stone that surrounds the mountain and is designated as a national historic site.



# Mt. Iwaki Kogoishi Remains

Headband-like huge rocks surround the 8th stage of Mt. Iwaki (about 2.6 kilometers). They are mysterious ancient ruins. It is designated as a National Historic Site, but we still don't know when, by whom, and for what purpose it was built.

#### lwaki Shrine

Located near the summit of Mt. Ishijo, the main shrine was rebuilt by Masahiro Ouchi in 1469, using the Kasuga-zukuri architectural style of the Muromachi period, and has been designated as an important cultural property of the country. Masu. From November 2021 to October 2020, the main shrine underwent major renovations for the first time in about 40 years.



# Zuishin Gate

Standing at the entrance to the approach to Ishiki Shrine, the secluded thatched gate gives off a mysterious atmosphere.



#### **Kaisho Street**

Kaisho Street was once a port of call for the kitamaebune, the trading ships that plied the waters around Japan. There are some old houses and shops and it still retains something of the old days.

#### **Fugen Temple**

There is a marvelous statue at the Niomon. And there is a beautiful garden designed by the famous ink wash painter, Sesshu.

#### Senko Temple

In Muromachi era, people entertained envoys from foreign countries and high officials in this temple. In the last days of the Tokugawa shogunate, it was the headquarters of the Second Kiheitai Militia.



# The Second Kiheitai Militia

It was formed in January 1865 as the Shinbutai at Senkoji Temple in Murozumi, and moved its headquarters to Fugenji Temple in February of the same year and was renamed the Nankiheitai. Furthermore, in April of the same year, they moved to Jingoji Temple on the summit of Mt. Ishijo, and Umesaburo Yamauchi, general manager of the Kiheitai, became the governor of both the Kiheitai and Minami Kiheitai, and they came to be known as the "Second Kiheitai." . Even today, Hikari City still has land, temples, monuments, etc. related to the Second Kiheitai, and there are many places that tell the history of that time.



#### Hikari Folk History Museum

There are some documents about kitamaebune. There are also soy sauce making machines and apparatuses on display.

#### Kanmuri Tenman Shrine

Sugawara Michizane dropped by this shrine on his way to Dazaifu. He was so impressed by the people's hospitality that he gave them

this Kanmuri (crown). That's why this Shrine was built here.



#### Hayaosa Hachiman Shrine

The Autumn Festival is held here every year on the second Sunday in October. Floats are brought out to celebrate the festival.

rich nature, including a plum blossom village, an event plaza, a children's forest with play equipment, and an auto campground.







#### **Plum Tree Grove**

There are 2,000 plum trees of about 100 varieties in Ume no Sato, which is adjacent to Kantenmangu Shrine, which is associated with Sugawara Michizane. The plum festival is held from early February to late February every year, and a variety of events are held every Saturday and Sunday during the festival, including Japanese music, dance, concerts, and tea ceremonies. You can see the Seto Inland Sea from the plum garden.



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#### **Rose Garden**

In the Rose Garden, there are about 1,400 roses of 330 different species. The sixty meter long tunnel of roses is a popular attraction.

# Ajisai En (Hydrangea Garden)

At the ``Hydrangea Garden" on the hillside of Hikari Sports Park, approximately 15,000 hydrangea plants of approximately 30 types, both native and introduced, change color from early to late June, including hydrangeas, loreleys, and rosy hydrangeas. During June, it is lit up by 9pm, creating a mysterious space.

#### Shakunage En (Rhododendron Garden)

Located within the precincts of Asae Shrine, approximately 600 trees of approximately 30 species are in full bloom. The large rhododendron flowers when in full bloom are a sight to behold.



#### Hikari Tsutsuji En (Hikari Azalea Garden)

From mid-April to early May, approximately 10,000 Hirado azaleas and Kurume azaleas bloom in the azalea garden near the city library.



#### Shimatagawa Riverside Park

The cherry and rapeseed flowers that blossom along the river create a wonderful pink and yellow path to walk along.
